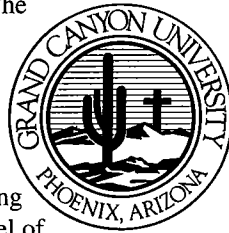

LOGOS

UNIVERSITY SEAL

When the Grand Canyon College Seal was adopted in 1950, two of its major components were the cross and the cactus. The saguaro cactus rises from its desert setting to signify the intellectual opportunity for Grand Canyon students, counteracting the arid mental state of uneducated man. The cross stands prominently on the horizon as a guide for spiritual enlightenment. Between the outer circle representing the earth and the inner circle representing the wheel of progress, the name of the University and its location are inscribed.



The use of the seal is permitted only with approval of the President of the University.

UNIVERSITY LOGO

The University logo is comprised of two parts-- a symbol and type. Drawing on the strongest point of identification in our name, the symbol suggests canyon walls. Nestled in the canyon ravine is a symbolic flame, open to interpretation as the eternal flame of knowledge or a flame of spiritual significance.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION LOGO

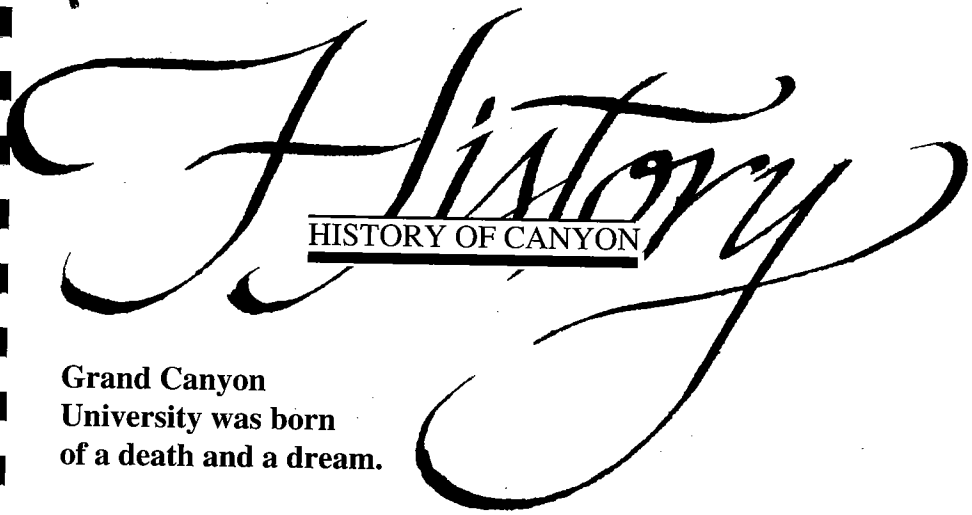

The illustration of the Antelope monument, a gift from the class of 1954, and the word Canyon, a familiar name for the University among its graduates, are the components for this newly developed symbol.

ATHLETICS LOGO

The Athletic logo is the symbol of the GCU mascot, the antelope, which is officially abbreviated as 'Lopes'. This logo is used by the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics for the nine athletic programs and must be authorized through that department.



Grand Canyon University was born of a death and a dream.

The demise was that of another small Baptist college, Montezuma, in New Mexico in the late 1920's. Two or three students and faculty of that school, consecrated there to the cause of Christian education, cached away a dream of one day helping build another school for the glory of God.

That dream resurfaced in the mid-1940's in a business meeting of Arizona Southern Baptists in Casa Grande. Pastor L.D. White of Calvary Baptist Church, Casa Grande, plopped a shiny silver dollar down on a wooden table at the front of the room, and proffered its value as the first donation toward a Baptist college in Arizona. Dozens of others followed, including a widow woman with a jar of pennies and one of the Montezuma alumni who wrote out a check for one hundred dollars. Enthusiasm seized everyone...everyone except Dr. Willis J. Ray.

Dr. Ray, a pastor and executive secretary of the fledgling Arizona Southern Baptist Convention, thought his fellow Baptists were getting in over their head. Asked to take up the offering, he politely but firmly declined.

Events over the next few years nearly proved him right. Enthusiasm waned as problems, setbacks, debts, and discouragements accumulated. Soon everyone had had it up to there with the whole idea...

...everyone but Willis J. Ray.

His faith crystallized even as others' melted, a fact the first board of trustees began to appreciate. Eventually, they asked Dr. Ray to serve as the little College's first president.

And one of those Montezuma alumni, Vernon Shipp, became the first chairman of the board of trustees. Another, Dr. Roland Beck, became Grand Canyon's first professor.

The classrooms of Grand Canyon University opened to some 93 students and not a little hoopla on September 13, 1949, in an abandoned armory building in Prescott. Twenty years of financial drought followed, spelled by occasional showers of generosity and the steady, sturdy growth of academic excellence and athletic reputation. During that time, October 8, 1951 to be exact, Grand Canyon opened up its doors on the present campus in Phoenix.

A handful of faithful pioneers — Roland Beck in education, his wife Betty, in English, Niles Puckett and D.C. Martin in religion, H. E. TenHarkle and Grace Weller in music, Shih-Ming Wang in mathematics, Clarice Maben in history, and David and Mildred Brazell in athletics — left their respective chances for prosperity to build a tiny college into a beacon of Christian education, one student at a time.

The work paid off with the announcement of regional accreditation by the North Central Association in 1968. National championships began to accrue in basketball, baseball, women's tennis. With the '80's, the academic program expanded into Colleges of Education, Nursing, Business, Performing Arts, and Arts and Sciences; master's programs were developed in Education and, beginning this fall, in Business.

The 1980's also witnessed an expansion of Canyon's guiding theme. A series of Spiritual Emphasis Week sermons by the Rev. Tom Wolf of the Church on Brady, Los Angeles fired the spirit and seized the imagination of Canyon faculty, staff and students in 1982. Wolf's theses -- that all Christians are commissioned to missions and missions support; that Canyon was uniquely positioned to address that commission; that mission work should increasingly depend not on evangelists but on laymen, giving witness while cultivating their secular professions in the international marketplace — became part of a new global emphasis at Grand Canyon.

That emphasis has been embodied in the work of some 450 Canyon faculty, staff, students, and friends, traveling to more than 50 countries in the course of the last eight years. Under the leadership of Treva Gibson, Canyon's Center for International Education is at the forefront of Southern Baptist mission work through education.

OUR PRESIDENT

Dr. Bill Williams has been president of Grand Canyon University since 1978 — the longest tenure of any president so far. A professor of mathematics, he is the first president to come out of the academic ranks, rather than the pastorate. Prior to the presidency, he served as chairman of both the department of math and natural sciences and the faculty as a whole.

His life has long been intertwined with that of the University: his father purchased one of the first bonds to finance the school, and Williams himself graduated from the then-College in 1962. He met and courted his wife, Shirley, while on the Grand Canyon faculty, and both of his children, Janelle and Bill, Jr. are now students at the University.

A deacon at North Phoenix Baptist Church, Dr. Williams holds a brown belt in karate and is known for pushing more than his weight on the Nautilus machine — and for pulling more than his weight everywhere else.

CANYON'S TRADITIONS

SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS WEEK

Held once each autumn and spring, this time of commitment brings a special speaker to Canyon's weekly chapel services and Bible studies, for a time of revival and recommitment.

FOUNDERS' DAY

Commemorates the leadership and sacrifice of those who, from the school's beginnings, linked their destiny with that of Grand Canyon University.

HARVEST FESTIVAL

Canyon's alternative to Halloween and an autumnal Homecoming; student clubs and organizations sponsor a carnival with game and food booths, a talent show, and the election of royalty.

CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PARTY

A 40-year Canyon tradition, cultivated by former P.E. professor Dr. Mildred Brazell, the party is sponsored and hosted by Canyon students, who treat under-privileged children from the Cash Elementary School, offering them dinner, a stuffed stocking of fruit, candy and prizes, a visit and gift from Santa Claus, and a telling of the Christmas story by Dr. D.C. Martin, professor of Religion.

HANGING OF THE GREEN

Canyon's traditional Christmas festivity for students, featuring a formal banquet, followed by a stroll around campus, singing Christmas carols and hanging wreaths on the buildings.

STALEY LECTURE SERIES

Sponsored through a special fund, the series brings a distinguished speaker to campus at the beginning of the Spring semester, to address Christian issues from an academic viewpoint.

HOMECOMING

The traditional celebration for Canyon alumni, featuring reunion gatherings, presentations of awards to outstanding alumni, outstanding athletic competitions, and musical dramatic productions in Ethington Theatre.

SPRING BANQUET

Sponsored by the Junior Class, this semi-formal occasion offers parting salutes to departing seniors and usually features entertainment drawn from the ranks of Canyon students and faculty.

HONORS DAY

Salutes outstanding academic performance, distinguished service, scholarship and award winners among both students and faculty.

UNIVERSITY DAY

Held on or near the first day of June, in honor of the 1989 transition from College to University, this occasion is marked by a brief devotional service, drawing on the testimonies of various faculty and staff, as a re-affirmation of the ideals and purpose that are Canyon.

UNIVERSITY PHONE SYSTEM

DIALING PLAN

Local calls	dial 9 + number
1-800 numbers	dial 9 + 1 + 800 + #

It is necessary to use your access code when making the calls listed below. When a long distance call is dialed you will hear a beeping tone, at which time you should dial in your access code. The new system will automatically dial in 1 + (602).

Local Information-dial 9 + 1 + (602) 555-1212 + at the beeping tone dial your 5 digit access code.

Long Distance Information-dial 9 + 1 + (ac) 555-1212 + at the beeping tone dial your 5-digit access code.

Long Distance Arizona-dial 9 + number + at the beeping tone dial your 5-digit access code.

Long Distance Out of State-dial 9 + (ac) + number + at the beeping tone dial your 5-digit access code.

International Calls-dial 9 + 0011 + country code + city code + number + at the beeping tone dial your 5-digit access code. (Calls to former Soviet Union-dial 9000 to reach operator)

Credit Card/Calling Card Calls-dial 9 + 000 + number + after a brief pause you will hear a low bong sound, enter card number. If you hesitate the operator will answer the line to assist you. If you proceed you may place the call yourself.

Mobil Phone Calls -dial 9 + 1 + (602) + number + at the beeping tone dial your 5 digit access code.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW

Your personal access code is just that — your's. It is your privilege and responsibility. Misuse costs you and the University time and money.

At the end of a long distance call it is very important that you make sure your call is hung up. Always check by picking up your phone to make sure you have a dial tone. Or by firmly holding the switchhook button down (hang up button). Do not flash the switchhook button. This will only leave your other line open and the long distance call will still be tolled for the time it remains open. If you do not hang up your phone correctly your phone call could still be billed to you even though you may be on another call. This can also happen if your call is not answered on the other end.

When calling the 911 emergency number it is very important to give the 911 operator the name of your residence hall and room number or your apartment and building number. The system that the 911 operator uses will only indicate that you are calling from Grand Canyon University but it will not give your specific location.

TELEPHONE SPECIAL FEATURES

Call Hold (switchhook, flash, *0)

This will allow you to place a call on hold while you make another call. To retrieve the call, hold the switchhook down and the call on hold will ring your phone.

Call Forwarding All Calls (*1)

Allows you to forward all your calls to another location/extension which will allow you to work on your home computer without interruption. And will allow you to receive calls while away from campus.

Cancel call forwarding all calls. (#1)

Enter call forwarding busy/don't answer. (*2/*3)

Cancel call forwarding busy/don't answer. (#2/#3)

Speed dial the last number you dialed. (#*)

Conference Calls

This can be done by dialing one extension to make connection with the first person. Then switchhook flash will give you a dial tone (this will put the first person on hold) allowing you to dial the second person. When connection is made, switchhook flash again to retrieve the first person. Conference calls can be made throughout campus.



COMPUTER CENTER

PC Labs - The University has three computer labs. The main lab in the Computer Center, an auxiliary lab in the Samaritan College of Nursing, and the Macintosh lab in the Music Building. The main lab offers IBM compatible 80286 computers, the auxiliary lab offers both IBM compatible and Macintosh computers. The Labs offer software such as WordPerfect 5.1, Lotus 123 version 2.3, Dbase III+, and a host of other helpful software. All labs are available to faculty and staff. You may reserve time in the main Lab and the Macintosh lab if you have a presentation or project that requires the use of computers. Contact Brent Davis at ext. 2845 to make reservations.

Printing - The PC Lab has three HP Laserjet Series III printers, a HP Paintjet XL (Color printer), and a HP Scanjet + available for your use. There will be a slight charge for color printing due to the cost of ink and special paper.

Data Displays - If you have a computer available to you and wish to have the class observe what you are doing on the computer, you might want to check out one of the two Data Displays. The Display plugs into your computer like a monitor and projects the computer image onto an overhead screen (an overhead projector is required). The Display is lightweight and will plug into any PC or Mac II computer. Due to the value of the Displays, students may not check them out. However, if you wish to check one out for a student, you may do so by assuming responsibility for its safety.

Purchasing Computers - If you wish to purchase a computer, you may now do so through the Computer Center. IBM compatibles and Macintoshes are available. Questions about any computer service or technical problems should be directed to Brent Davis or Steve Wade in the Computer Center at ext. 2845.

BOOKSTORE

In addition to textbooks and student supplies, the GCU Bookstore (serviced by Follett Co.) stocks miscellaneous office and educational supplies, Canyon imprinted gifts and clothing, class rings, greeting cards, music tapes, electronic supplies, Bibles, health aids, and snacks.

You may get your film processed at the Bookstore, and special order books and office supplies. Items and services from the bookstore may be purchased by using a Validine, MasterCard, VISA, American Express, Discover or personal check.

COPY SERVICES

Copy services are available to all offices, faculty, staff, and students. A wide variety of services are available, including photocopies (enlargements and reductions), drilling, GBC bindings, shrink wrapping, etc. Service is provided by Imaging Systems.

MAILROOM

All campus mail is processed through the Mail Center. Most of the major postal services are available such as first-class mail, Express Mail, Federal Express, U.P.S. shipping and receiving, certified mail, and stamp sales. Additionally bulk mailing services are available including folding and inserting.

HEALTH CENTER

Faculty and staff are welcome at the Cooke Health Center, which is located on campus in the northwest corner opposite the gym. The campus physicians are on GCU's health insurance plan and you can be seen in the Health Center for acute health problems or emergency care during working hours. The charge is a \$10 co-pay plus any lab fees. Some prescription medications, such as antibiotics, are available for cost plus a handling fee.

Students are our first priority. However, we haven't had any problem seeing those employees who need to be seen. Visits to the Health Center to see the physicians are by appointment only. We also have Certified Nurse Midwives who are available for well-woman care.

You do not need to have an appointment to see the nurse, April Polley.

Health Center hours are Monday-Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The University physicians are here Tuesday-Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. and Fridays, 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.

Allergy shots can be given during the time the physicians are at the Health Center. You must provide written orders from your physician and the serum. The cost per injection is \$1.00.

SECURITY

To contact Grand Canyon Security, call ext. 2400. The Security office is located at the west end of the apartment complex, just east of the Plant Services building. At least one staff member is on-call 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

The objective of Grand Canyon's security department is to deter on-campus crimes against students, faculty, staff and facilities.

Though not issued firearms, Canyon security officers carry radios that put them in immediate contact with local law enforcement, fire and medical personnel.

Security officers can provide faculty and staff with appropriate access to campus buildings after hours and on weekends.

PLANT SERVICES

Contact with Plant Services can be reached at ext. 2888. The Plant Services building is located just west of the apartment complex.

The University has about 200 personnel and 1,900 students (some with families), lodged in 31 buildings and a 153-unit apartment complex, spread over some 70 acres of property. Providing a pleasant environment for all requires the cooperation and assistance of each of us.

The University has contracted with ServiceMASTER, an international consulting and management organization, to assist in the Plant Services area. The director of operations, however, is the only ServiceMASTER employee. The other 20-plus personnel are Grand Canyon employees.

Organizationally, that staff is divided into three responsibilities: maintenance, custodial and grounds. Each group is supervised by a foreman who reports to the director.

In addition to their regular day-to-day routines, the staff are required to do preventative and casualty work. The former requires periodic inspection of every piece of equipment on campus, but makes for longer and more economical use of our tools.

Faculty and/or staff who require work in their office or classroom must submit a work order through the inter-office mail. Emergency items can usually be taken care of by a phone request.

Items requiring construction need budget approval from both the vice president and/or dean of a particular area. Final approval and a timetable is determined jointly by the Plant Services director and the vice president to whom he reports.

In order to protect faculty and staff from a liability issue, a new key policy will be instituted during fall 1991.

Reserves — Library materials or personal copies may be placed on reserve for specific class assignments at the library circulation/reference desk. We offer 2 hour, 1 day, 3 day, or 1 week circulation options. Please allow 24 hours for processing before sending students over for the reserved items. PLEASE BE AWARE OF COPYRIGHT REGULATIONS.

Interlibrary Loans — If we do not have resources in our library, we can get them through a nationwide lending network. This service requires advance planning as materials take two to four weeks to arrive.

BENEFITS

Grand Canyon University offers a comprehensive benefits program to both faculty and staff. The following is a brief summary. All employees are eligible for benefits after completing a 30-day probationary period.

VACATION

Full-time (40 hours per week) staff employees who have worked at Grand Canyon less than five years accrue 3.08 hours of vacation time each pay period, or ten days per year. After five years of full-time employment, employees accrue at 4.62 hour per pay period, or 15 days per year.

Accrued vacation time will be prorated for part-time employees working less than 40 hours but more than 17.5 hours per week.

Employees may use vacation time only when approved by their supervisors based on the consideration of the operational needs of the University.

SICK LEAVE/PERSONAL LEAVE

Full-time employees accrue 3.08 hours of sick leave per month, or 10 days per year. Three of these may be classified as personal days and require a 48-hour notice for supervisory approval. All accrued, unused sick/personal days are defined as short term disability and are accumulated as follows:

1. Full-time faculty may accumulate up to 14 work weeks of sick leave.
2. Full-time staff may accrue up to 120 working days of sick leave.

Accrued sick leave will be prorated for part-time employees who work less than 40 hours, but more than 17.5 hours per week.

PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS

For more information about payroll deductions, contact the Payroll office at ext. 2880.

LIFE INSURANCE

The University pays the premium on a term life insurance policy for each employee equal to the amount of the employee's annual base salary.

The University also provides life insurance in the amount of \$5,000 for the spouse and each dependent child.

ACCIDENTAL DEATH AND DISMEMBERMENT

The University provides the amount of their annual base salary for employees at no cost.

LONG TERM DISABILITY

The University provides long-term disability coverage for all permanent employees who work over 17.5 hours per week. Payment of benefit begins after six months of total disability

WORKER'S COMPENSATION

An employee who is injured on the job will be compensated in accordance with the requirements of the Arizona State Worker's Compensation Law.

MEDICAL/DENTAL/VISION COVERAGE

The University provides a partial self-funded health insurance benefit which includes both features of a PPO plan and major medical insurance. The plan is administered through Benefit Claims Payors and, in addition to health insurance, includes dental and vision coverage. Complete information can be obtained in the Benefits Booklet which is available in the Human Resources Department.

RETIREMENT PLAN

The retirement plan is open to all employees who have attained age 25 and have completed one year of eligibility service. The University will match contributions in an amount equal to the employee's contributions up to a maximum amount of 5 percent of gross wages. Employees may choose to participate in either the Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention or TIAA/CREF retirement programs. All accounts are fully vested.

TUITION SCHOLARSHIP

Tuition scholarships for both faculty and staff are available with full information provided by the Financial Aid Office.
