ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS WITH FOREIGN CREDENTIALS

These admission requirements apply to foreign students who possess educational credentials from secondary schools, colleges, universities and technical or vocational schools outside the U.S. These requirements also apply to those currently living outside the U.S. who wish to earn a degree online at GCU. To apply, you must provide:

- A signed application for admissions and enrollment agreement.
- Previous coursework and degrees that have been evaluated by a university-approved evaluation service, as indicated in the University Policy Handbook.
 GCU can also assist in the evaluation process. To request GCU's assistance, contact us at 855-GCU-LOPE and request to speak to an international enrollment counselor or our foreign credentials team. Non-English credentials are required to be translated by a certified translator prior to the time of submission.
- An official document demonstrating high school or secondary school completion. Foreign students who do not have a conferred degree completion
 above high school or secondary school are required to supplement their high school or secondary school credentials for evaluation. Non-English foreign
 credentials must be translated by a certified translator prior to the time of submission.
- Passing results from an English as a foreign language test. If your native language is not English, you must submit evidence of English proficiency. Original TOEFL, IELTS or TOEIC test results are acceptable. You may also take the online Berlitz examination; contact us at 855-GCU-LOPE and ask for an enrollment counselor for more information.

In some instances, English proficiency may be exempted. See the current University Policy Handbook for more information.

- GPA score, if required by the preferred degree program. Certain programs have GPA requirements for admissibility. The GPA assessed on the official
 evaluation of foreign credentials is used to determine if the minimum GPA requirement has been met as determined by the University Policy Handbook. You
 can also contact GCU to determine whether your GPA qualifies you for a degree program.
- Program and prerequisite requirements, as needed. Some programs have specific program and prerequisite requirements, which are described in the University Policy Handbook. You can also contact GCU for more information.
