[^] Scholarships may be awarded based on incomplete transcripts. At the time in which final, official transcripts are received, GCU reserves the right to rescind or modify the scholarship if it is determined that eligibility was not achieved. To be eligible, you must meet scholarship requirements. GCU reserves the right to decline scholarship awards for any reason. If you do not meet the minimum renewal criteria, your scholarship will be forfeited. GCU reserves the right to change scholarship awards at any time without notice.

GCU scholarships may be combined up to the following limits:

- i. Chancellor/President Award recipients in campus housing – up to \$16,500
- ii. All other scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$14,000
- iii. All scholarship recipients living off campus – up to \$11,500
- iv. Micro-scholarships may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships. Micro-scholarships may replace GCU institutional aid – up to \$6,000 per academic year.

* Priority Registration Award: This program awards scholarships from \$250-\$1,000 per academic year based on the number of awards available at the time of registration and whether students live on or off campus. This award is renewable annually for the fall and spring semesters, as long as the student maintains the minimum GCU GPA required for attendance. Requirements for registration and attendance may vary by program. All requirements for registration and attendance must be met to receive this award.

** CSET Award (Programmatic Awards for Computer Science, Information Technology, Computer Programming and Engineering majors): This program awards \$1,000 (non CCSC award recipients) or \$2,000 (CCSC award recipients) per academic year to students who are admissible to GCU and enroll in one of our computer science, information technology, computer programming or engineering programs. This award is renewable for fall and spring semesters, as long as the student maintains the minimum GCU GPA required for attendance and stays enrolled in a computer science, information technology, computer programming or engineering program at GCU (limit eight semesters). There are a limited number of awards available. These awards are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

*** Grand Canyon State University Award (in-state and out-of-state): This program offers \$1,000 per academic year to Arizona students and \$250 to out-of-state students who graduate from one of Grand Canyon University's participant high schools. Students attending one of the Maricopa County Community College campuses must have earned an associate degree or equivalent, to qualify for the award. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring semesters, as long as the student maintains the minimum GCU GPA required for attendance. This award cannot be combined with the Canyon Christian Consortium Award.

++ Canyon Christian Schools Consortium (CCSC) Award: Qualified students must have graduated from a CCSC participant school. The scholarship awards \$5,000 per academic year to on-campus students who are admissible and \$2,500 per academic year to off-campus students. This award is renewable for fall and spring semesters based on the number of years a CCSC member high school was attended. In order to renew the student must maintain the minimum GPA required for attendance, join a campus worship service weekly and meet the 20-hour service requirement each semester, as determined by the university. Recipients of the CCSC award are ineligible for the Grand Canyon University Award.

◇ Students who have less than 24 attempted college credits must use their high school GPA to qualify for academic scholarships. Students who have 24 or more attempted college credits must use their cumulative college GPA to qualify for academic scholarships

+ Students must complete at least 60 transferable credits at an MCCC school.
