## SECTION A: Dependency status change due to unusual circumstances

According to the 2016-2017 Federal regulations for Federal Title IV funding, a student is independent if he meets any one of the following criteria:

- The student was born before January 1, 1993
- The student is a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces
- At the beginning of the 2016-2017 school year, the student is a graduate/professional student
- The student is currently or was in legal guardianship by someone other than parent or stepparent
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless by the student's high school or school district homeless liaison on or after July 1, 2015
- At the age of 13, both parents were deceased and student was in foster care or was dependent/ward of the court

- The student has dependents other than a spouse/children who live with the student and receive more than half of the support from the student now through June 30, 2017
- The student is currently or was an emancipated minor
- The student is married on the date he submitted his FAFSA
- The student has children and provides more than half of his support between July 1, 2016 and June 30, 2017
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless by the director of emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development any time on or after July 1, 2015
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or was selfsupporting and at risk of being homeless by the director of a runaway of homeless youth basic center or transitional living program any time on or after July 1, 2015
- The student is on active duty in the U.S Armed Forces for purposes other than training

If a student does not meet any one of the above requirements to automatically qualify as an independent student for financial aid purposes, but feels he should be considered as an independent student because of *Unusual Circumstances*, the student may complete and submit this form to his GCU Student Services Counselor. The application will be reviewed by the Office of Financial Aid.

## Unusual circumstances include an abusive family environment or abandonment by parents.

The following conditions **DO NOT** qualify as reasons for a dependency override:

- Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education
- Parents are unwilling to provide information on the FAFSA or for verification
- Parents do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency

By law, the Office of Financial Aid is allowed to use "professional judgment" on a case-by-case basis to determine if a student would meet the criteria to be considered independent. The student must provide documentation to support this request. The documentation must be consistent and relate to the student's special circumstances that differentiate the student from the conditions of other students.

Generally, the documentation of unusual circumstances should come from two third parties who know the student's situation (such as a teacher or member of the clergy), but in cases where this is not available, the school can accept a signed and dated statement from the student or a family member detailing the unusual circumstances (This does <u>not</u> apply to marital status update request).

The student can only be a dependent of a biological/adoptive parent; a foster parent or legal guardian is not treated as a parent for Financial Aid purposes.

According to Federal Regulation, all information provided by the student must support the final decision of the Office of Financial Aid and the decision cannot be appealed to the U.S. Department of Education.

Please note: Federal Regulations state that a student's claim that his parents refusal to contribute to his college education and/or parental unwillingness to provide information on the FAFSA or information needed for verification is not a reason for a "Dependency Override".
