SECTION A: Dependency status change due to unusual circumstances

According to the 2021-2022 Federal regulations for Federal Title IV funding, a student is independent if he meets any one of the following criteria:

- The student was born before January 1, 1998
- The student is a veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces
- At the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, the student is a graduate/professional student
- The student is currently or was in legal guardianship by someone other than parent or stepparent as determined by the Court
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or at risk by the student's high school or school district homeless liaison on or after July 1, 2020
- At any time since the age of 13, both parents were deceased and student was in foster care or was dependent/ward of the court
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or at risk by the director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development any time on or after July 1, 2020
- The student was determined to be an unaccompanied youth who was homeless or was self-supporting and at risk of being homeless by the director of a runaway of homeless youth basic center or transitional living program any time on or after July 1, 2020
- The student is on active duty in the U.S Armed Forces for purposes other than training
- The student has dependents other than a spouse/children who live with the student and receive more than half of the support from the student now through June 30, 2022
- The student is currently or was an emancipated minor as determined by the court
- The student is married on the date he submitted his FAFSA
- The student has or will have children who will receive more than half of their support from the student between July 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022

If a student does not meet any one of the above requirements to automatically qualify as an independent student for financial aid purposes, but feels he should be considered as an independent student because of *Unusual Circumstances*, the student may complete and submit this form to his GCU Student Services Counselor. The application will be reviewed by the Office of Financial Aid.

- W-2s if student had filed taxes jointly with spouse so income can be separated
- Parent's 2019 IRS Tax Return Transcript
- Copy of Divorce Decree if divorced; Death Certificate if widowed
- Completed and signed Separation of Income form (will be provided at a later date)
