



ACCOMMODATION TYPES

Student Disability Services (SDS) walks alongside students to help them on a temporary basis as they recover from a medical issue, as well as to help students with a long-term disability be supported as they build up their skills to apply beyond their college experience and into the workforce.

ACADEMIC

- **Extended Time on Assignments and Testing Accommodations**

These accommodations are most common across all modalities and serves a wide variety of disability issues.

- **Accessible Course Materials**

GCU courses are purposely created with accessibility in mind. If a student comes across any course materials that they have difficulty accessing, they can connect with the SDS Office for assistance.

- **Face-to-Face Classes vs. Online Modality**

Accommodations may vary based on the modality of the course and are subject to specific course requirements or program-specific essential elements.

Academic accommodations that may have been available in high school may not be applicable in the university setting.

All accommodation requests are reviewed on a case-by-case basis.



HOUSING

- **Accessibility Features**

Examples: Roll-in shower or other lowered features.

- **Assistive Animals**

May require additional documentation for the animal.

- **Food Tours**

Offers a comprehensive understanding of the food available on campus and the resources available for campus dining.

OTHER

- **Parking**
- **Mobility**
- **Special events**
- **Pregnancy**

Pregnancy is considered a temporary disability issue and is also protected under Title IX.

ASD CONNECTION
