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

Students must be self-starters and able to work with university students and professors on daily laboratory research. Acceptance to the program through an application process is required to obtain a STEM internship. Prior high school academic experience in the student's field of interest is necessary. ¹Only available to select Arizona high schools and organizations. Scholarship awards are intended to cover tuition, applicable enrollment and program fees and all other non-room and board costs. Tuition and fees will be covered by a combination of aid such as scholarships and grants from federal, state, private and institutional sources. The scholarship package cannot be applied toward parking, health insurance, housing or meal plan rates and is not transferable, nor does it hold any cash value. This scholarship package is renewable for up to three years for eligible students who make timely applications for renewal and meet all academic requirements. (Note: GCU strongly recommends a minimum of 50 hours of service in the GCU Learning Lounge per academic year in order to receive the letter of recommendation). To remain eligible, a student must be continuously enrolled full-time in the fall or spring semester and be in good academic standing. Full-time enrollment constitutes enrollment in 12 credits or more, eight of which must be on the traditional campus. GCU reserves the right to decline to award a scholarship for any reason. A scholarship will not be renewed if a student does not meet the minimum renewal criteria. GCU reserves the right to change scholarship award and/or renewal criteria at any time without prior notice.
