GCU-Funded Institutional Aid

At Grand Canyon University, we offer generous scholarship opportunities to help make a private Christian education affordable. The average traditional campus student pays \$8,900* in annual tuition, which reduces overall tuition by nearly half. We have proudly maintained this traditional campus rate for 13 years and our frozen tuition will continue to remain steady in 2022-23.

In 2020, GCU's campus students received over \$157 million in scholarships. To maintain a GCU-funded institutional scholarship each year, students must be an admitted campus traditional undergraduate student and meet scholarship requirements. The following GCU-funded academic scholarships are renewable annually and can be locked in for up to four years for most programs. Visit gcu.edu/CampusScholarships for more information.

High School Academic Scholarship Program

High school student scholarships are based on their weighted high school GPA. If they do not have a weighted GPA, they can apply their unweighted GPA (minimum of 2.5 GPA) plus ACT or SAT test score.

Indirect Academic Scholarship Program

Transfer, GAP Year and High School International F-1 Visa Students

Students who are enrolling with GCU and are not eligible for the high school academic scholarship program (enrolled at GCU the semester following high school graduation), or students who are attending with an International F-1 Visa may be eligible for a transfer scholarship. A transfer scholarship is based on a student's unweighted high school GPA, their cumulative college transfer GPA if they have six or more college credits, or their ACT/SAT scores. ACT/SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.
